### Teaching for Clinicians: Overview

The modules are designed to enhance supervision and teaching skills for any doctors in clinical environments in the ACT and SENSW training region who are supervising medical students and/or junior doctors.

This course is designed for the busy clinician and will require some short pre-reading activities but most of the learning takes place through interactive group work during the workshops. Doctors who have undertaken the complete Teaching for Clinician's course are eligible to apply for the Teaching in Medicine Pathway if they are actively teaching ANU medical students in their clinical role.

**Modules 1-5 (Part 1)** involves core modules around teaching, supervision, and feedback. For junior doctors and registrars, the focus is on supervising medical students. For senior doctors the focus is on student and junior doctor supervision. **In 2023 the course for senior doctors will also have modules that address the new prevocational framework for JMO supervisors.**

**Modules 6-9 (Part 2)** enables participants to fulfil the requirements for the Associate Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy (AFHEA, administered by Advance HE) through the Australian National University Educational Fellowship Scheme.
